# **OSTP School Year Update:**

We are currently offering Out-of-School Time programming at 12 afterschool locations which include (3) LINK Club locations, (2) ESSER locations, and (2) specialty programs (Youth Achieving Greatness and TR Achieving Greatness).

# **Current Summer Enrollment:** 821

We are currently offering the OSTP Summer Power-On/ Power-Up program at 14 locations which include (2) specialty programs Camp Adventure and TR Camp Adventure.

#### **Program Wrap-ups:**

• On March 8, teens at the Patrick Henry Recreation Center attended the **Wizards vs. Hornets NBA game**. Teens and staff used the Metro bus which served as an educational opportunity to acquire practical skills in navigating public transportation systems. Teens enjoyed the game and were surprised with complimentary souvenirs.



• On March 8, the Durant Center partnered with the Boys and Girls Club of Alexandria to host a **Teen Glow Party**. We were excited to invite 110 local teens, ages 12-15 to enjoy our DJ/glow room, spray tattoos, Art Mobile activities, video game tournament, Tik Tok room, and of course pizza!



• On March 21, the William Ramsay Recreation Center hosted a **March Madness Teen Appreciation event**. The night consisted of a 3-point shooting contest, a King of the Court one-on-one challenge, and a 3-on-3 tournament. During the night, our teen participants were able to win trophies and/or silver medals while also building their teamwork skills, bonding with each other, and having fun in an organized safe space!

 On March 26, the Nannie J. Lee Recreation Center's 5 & 6year-old participants were chiefs for the day and prepared a healthy snack for the other age groups. They enjoyed making "One Tough Cookie" with only 4 ingredients (Bananas, Oats, Apple Sauce, and Chocolate Chips).



• On March 27, Nannie J. Lee Recreation Center had a special collaboration with the **Mobile Art Lab**. Participants enjoyed making Easter bag totes and were able to design and express their creativity through art. They also enjoyed making paper roller coasters for STEM, using construction paper and imagination.

# Ben Brenman LED Lighting Retrofits Project Managers: Matt Melkerson, T&ES

The City will be upgrading the existing streetlight fixtures in Ben Brenman Park, Cameron Station Linear Park, and Armistead Boothe Park to LED technology starting April 23, 2024. There are numerous benefits to upgrading the existing streetlight fixtures, including significantly higher energy efficiency in furtherance of the City's EcoCity goals, and higher reliability resulting in lower maintenance costs. Work will be performed Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 3:30 PM and is expected to take approximately two weeks to complete. All park trails and roadways

#### **Division Update**

The City of Alexandria runs two community gardens, one at Chinquapin Recreation Center & Aquatics facility and near Holmes Run Parkway. The gardening season runs from March 1 through November 30 each year and there are 200 plots available for rent with priority given to Alexandria residents. This year, the City of Alexandria registered a total of 176 plots at Chinquapin and 24 at Holmes Run – 18 new gardeners at Chinquapin and six (6) at Holmes Run. Because of high interest in gardening, there are waitlists for both gardens.

G-max testing began on Tuesday, April 2nd on playgrounds. The purpose of G-max testing to reduce the severity of head injuries due to falls onto playground surface. Testing is done in accordance with American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) standards. The testing equipment consists of a tripod, e-missile and a handheld controller. ### **Division Update**

- Urban Forestry planted a white oak at Windmill Park with the Mayor and City Leadership to commemorate our 275th year as a City.
- Urban Forest Manager, Phil Jubert, spoke at 3 neighborhood association meetings and the Beautification Commission. The intent was for introductions, provide a resource for the community, and to inform residents on how they can help our city tree canopy through volunteering (Tree Stewards, PARKnerships) and Alex311 ticket requests.
- State of Virginia Forestry Department donated a plaque at a ceremony to recognize Alexandria for being a Tree City USA member for the 41st year.
- Urban Forestry Department is developing plans to host a statewide forestry event, put on by Trees Virginia, in May. We are expecting up to 150 Arborists throughout the State to attend the event at the Lee Center.
- Urban Forest Manager Phil Jubert and Civic Engineer Camille Liebnitzky introduced to the Beautification Commission a Tree Planting Project currently underway by TES as a component of the Storm Water Management program.
- The Natural Land Management division remains engaged in inspecting, treating, and eliminating invasive plants across the city. This spring, Park Services will focus on inspecting and treating ephemeral and broadleaf invasive species.
