All services are located at 4480 King Street unless otherwise noted. Operating hours vary by service.

Adolescent Health*

3701 W. Braddock Road

Free health care for young people ages 12-19 years old, residing in Alexandria city, including sports and school physicals, minor illness/injury treatment, immunizations, STI & HIV testing, pregnancy testing, family planning, and counseling.

Communicable Disease Control

Receives reports of reportable communicable diseases from health care providers and laboratories, take actions to prevent further spread of disease. Provides guidance to schools, nursing homes, and other groups to prevent and control outbreaks of illness. Monitors disease trends in Alexandria.

Dental Clinic*

Offers preventive care and education to children, and emergency care only for adults. Services for children include cleaning, fluoride, sealants, complete oral exams, fillings and extractions. Denture program for those 60 years of age and older.

Environmental Health

Performs evaluations of and investigates complaints about permitted facilities such as restaurants, grocery stores, swimming pools and hotels. Helps citizens control vectors such as mosquitoes, bed bugs and other insects and educates residents about rabies prevention. Assists citizens with problems such as indoor air quality, mold, lead paint, drinking water, and other environmental health hazards.

Please bring all immunization records with you to the visit.

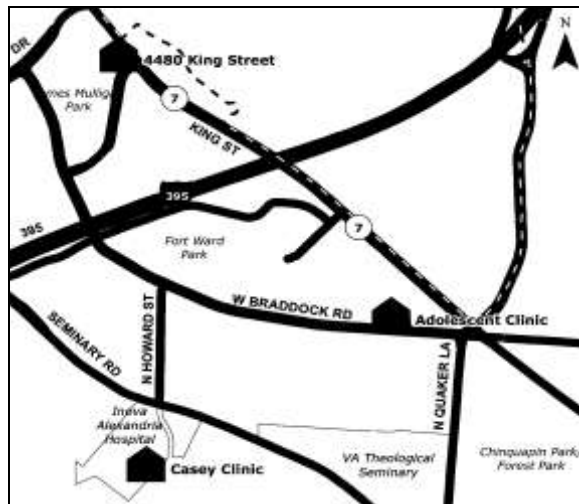
Vital Records Ext. 200 or 201
