Step I: Dial **703.229.8632** into your cellular phone and follow the prompts as necessary.

Step 2: Key in the number of the location that you want to learn more about.

Step 3: After pressing the number of the location you are interested in, press #.

For a new location follow steps 2-3.

ith centuries of history and hospitality to its credit, Alexandria offers an array of historic and cultural attractions. The city's many historic homes, churches, businesses and museums allow residents and visitors alike to experience the hands of the past that makes our city the charming and historic town it is today.

Seven of the city's premier historic sites are owned and operated by the City of Alexandria and fall under the administration of the Office of Historic Alexandria. These sites – The Lyceum, Gadsby's Tavern Museum, Stabler-Leadbeater Apothecary Museum, Alexandria Black History Museum, Friendship Firehouse, Fort Ward Museum, and the Alexandria Archaeology Museum – bring Alexandria's varied and storied history to life. Additionally, Alexandria has many more historic sites which are open to the public and tell a significant part of the city's historical tale.

Many of the museums have different activities and services that are open to the public which include Girl Scout and Boy Scout programs, living history events, reenactments, open houses, lectures, musical programs, summer camps, encampments, walking tours, research requests, rental opportunities, podcasts, changing exhibits, and special holiday events.
