1. WELCOME AND CALL TO ORDER

The Environmental Policy Commission meeting was called to order by Chair Hoekstra at 7:30 PM.

1. EPC BY-LAWS

The Chair introduced the revised by-laws having only one change regarding the EPC role in advocating for climate change and its impacts. The revised by-laws will be voted on at the next EPC meeting on January 24, 2022.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Scott Barstow thanked the EPC for its effort on climate change and suggested that the commission speed up its pressure for sustainability implementation since time is of the essence.

3. EPC/PC JOINT WORK SESSION

PC members pointed out the difference in mandates for the two commissions with EPC mandates focused on advising on policy and PC mandates focused on enforcing the zoning ordinance and implementing the City Master Plan.

The members from both commissions then discussed several ideas and areas for collaboration for advancing the sustainability agenda for the City including the following:

- Make the EAP 2040 plan become a binding document
- Housing is a fertile area for collaboration
- Adopt policies on a city-wide basis instead of applying these only on smaller scales such as SAP or DSUP
- How to get existing developments to align with the City's sustainability effort
- City's sustainability principles versus the developers' push for short-term economics

As a next step, the two commissions will form a work group with a few (2-3) members from each commission charged with developing a draft memo to be sent to City Council for advocating for actions to respond to the climate crisis. Transportation Commission might be invited to join this work group as well.
