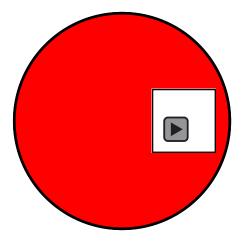

Background: Grant Information

• The Low-No Program:

- Supports the transition of transit fleets to the lowest polluting and most energy efficient vehicles.
- Provides funding for the purchase or leasing of zero-emission and lowemission transit buses and supporting facilities.

• The Bus and Bus Facilities Program:

• Assists in the financing of buses and bus facilities capital projects, including replacing, rehabilitating, or purchasing buses and bus-related facilities.

City Budget Update



Budget Overview

- On February 28, the City Manager presented City Council with a proposed operating and capital budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024
- Adoption is scheduled for Wednesday, May 3.
- Proposed budget
 - General Fund Base Operating Budget FY24: \$881.1 million
 - 10-year CIP Budget FY24-33: \$2.39 billion

Transportation Operating Highlights

- Fully funding Metro obligations including an expected increase in jurisdictional operating subsidy by \$4.0 million, from \$52.6 million to \$56.6 million. This increase is planned to be funded through the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission (NVTC) with no increase in the General Fund contribution.
- 18% increase in DASH funding from FY23 to meet increased operating costs and decreased TRIP grant funding.



Transportation CIP Highlights

- \$100 thousand to support planning for the Envision Route 7 regional bus rapid transit project
- \$4.8 million to support DASH Bus Fleet Replacement and Electrification for FY24
- \$1 million added to Complete Streets-Vision Zero to conduct high crash intersection audits
- \$1 million added to the Mount Vernon Avenue North project
- \$1.2 million increase for Landmark Mall 395 Ramp Improvement Project

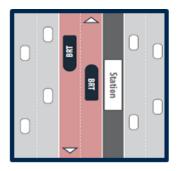
