### **BAR Review Levels**

These levels of review are applicable in most cases. Please note that during the administrative review process, Staff may determine that a project must be reviewed by the Board. Contact Staff at 703.746.3833 to confirm which level of review is required for your project.

#### **NO BAR REVIEW**

Construction of fences and freestanding planter/retaining walls less than 2 feet in height

Demolition of masonry walls less than 25 square feet in area

# ADMINISTRATIVE (STAFF) REVIEW

Construction or modification of fences, gates, garden walls, and retaining walls

#### **BOARD REVIEW**

Demolition of masonry walls greater than or equal to 25 square feet in area

### Introduction

Fences, gates, garden walls, and retaining walls on private property are important visual features of the historic district that provide distinctive streetscapes while also providing a sense of privacy and enclosure for property owners. Fences are often partially transparent and, in the historic district, are made of a number of materials including wood, metal, and masonry. Garden walls are constructed of masonry and provide a visual barrier. Many historic structures have fences that were added later which may, over time, have acquired independent historic significance.

### **Guidelines**

- o Demolition of masonry walls greater than or equal to 25 square feet in area requires a BAR Permit to Demolish.
- o The design of fences, gates, garden walls, and retaining walls should be architecturally appropriate to the architectural style of the structure they surround.
- o Fences and walls should be made of wood, metal, and/or unit masonry. The Board discourages using synthetic materials such as fiberglass, poured-in-place concrete, or vinyl.
- o Wood fences should have vertical pickets.
- o Ornamental iron or metal fences are appropriate for late 19th- and early 20th-century Victorian structures.

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

### **Additional Information**

- For guidelines on planter walls, refer to chapter on planters. 0
- A survey plat may be required to ensure the fence or wall is located on the subject property.
- Fences located in front yards must be 50 percent open and cannot exceed 4 feet in height. Fences located in rear and side yards may be open or closed and cannot exceed 6 feet in height. Refer to §7-202 of the Zoning Ordinance.
- Fences cannot be located in a vision clearance area. Refer to §7-800 of the Zoning Ordinance.
- The Board may waive height, opacity, and vision clearance requirements specified in the Zoning Ordinance when the proposed fence is architecturally appropriate and consistent with the character of the district.
- Retaining walls less than two feet in height, and fences at the height and location otherwise permitted in a front yard, may be constructed in the public right-of-way in compliance with § 5-2-29 of the City Code.



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
