Throughout their internship, these students were able to gain hands-on experience with animal care, program facilitation, and understanding the general operations of a nature center. We look forward to hosting another set of interns in 2025!

 hosted Teen Skate
 Night. The event was a
 fantastic gathering,
 drawing over 40
 enthusiastic teens
 together for fun and





community bonding. In addition to the skating, we were fortunate to have representatives from YHELP and Keep It 360 Advocate present. They set up informative tables to share their valuable resources and services with the teens.

On May 27, Mount Vernon Recreation Center hosted its annual Memorial Day
program. The outdoor ceremony honored posthumous Medal of Honor recipient,
POW/MIA, RANGER Hall of Fame inductee, and Distinguished Member of the Special
Forces Regiment Captain Rocky Versace, the 67 other Alexandrians who died during the
Vietnam War, and all members of the U.S. Armed Forces who made the ultimate
sacrifice.

 On May 29, the Minnie Howard Campus and Aquatics Facility had its ribbon-cutting ceremony. City Council and School Board elected officials, plus ACPS and City leaders, including the RPCA team that will manage the aquatics facility, were in attendance and conducted walkthroughs.



Waterfront Parks LED Lighting Retrofits Project Managers: Matt Melkerson, T&ES

The City will be upgrading the existing park light fixtures in Rivergate Park, Oronoco Bay Park, Founders Park, Waterfront Park, and Roberdeau Park to LED technology in the fall 2024. These parks are the next phase of LED light conversions following the recently completed phase for parks around Cameron Station. There are numerous benefits to upgrading the existing light fixtures, including significantly higher energy efficiency in furtherance of the City's EcoCity goals, and higher reliability resulting in lower maintenance costs. All park trails and paths will

Potomac Yard Park

Project Managers: Daniel Unkle, Urban Planner III

The City is working with JBG Smith to complete construction of the approximately five-acre addition to Potomac Yard Park. The park is the last component of the uninterrupted 'green spine' of parkland and offroad multi-use trails envisioned in the 1999 plan for Potomac Yard. The park is anticipated to be completed this summer. The new park includes a multi-use trail, play space, fitness area, viewing mound, lawn areas, and pavilion/seating areas.

Urban Forestry

- Urban Forestry dedicated a white oak tree at the Judy Guse-Noritake Park to celebrate the life of former Alexandrian and long-time volunteer of the Park Commission.
- We completed our seasonal spring planting season by installing over 325 trees throughout the city. We are currently on pace to plant over 1,000 trees this calendar year.
- Urban Forestry Manager, Phil Jubert, was an invited guest speaker at the Lynhaven Civic Association. His message was how the public can participate in protecting and growing our Urban Canopy through volunteer hours and Alex311 requests.
- The Urban Forestry team increased our tree watering capabilities by deploying 2 in-house watering units to partner with our contract watering services.

Project Title: Celandine Season at Several Natural Areas Project Managers: Natural Resources Staff

The Natural Resources Division continues its efforts to control invasive species, focusing on the eradication of Celandine, Bamboo, Japanese Honeysuckle, Poison Ivy, and other broadleaf targets for July and August. These efforts are crucial for preserving native plant diversity, maintaining ecosystem balance, and protecting water quality. By addressing these invasives, we

prevent them from outcompeting native species for essential resources, thereby supporting the overall health of local ecosystems. Our ongoing work enhances the resilience and sustainability of the environment.
