#### Hang Up on Deputy Imposters and Stop Scams

Scammers are still calling potential victims and impersonating deputies, police officers and court officials to try to intimidate victims into giving them money. This happens in Alexandria, throughout the region and across the country and if it happens to you, hang up immediately! No real law enforcement agency or court will ever call you and demand money. Please talk about this with friends and family who are not active online so they are aware. Encourage them to hang up, even if the caller sounds convincing or threatens them with arrest. If you have been a victim, be sure to report it to local police.
