Out of School Time Program (OSTP) School Year Update:

Current Summer 2024 Enrollment: 1066

We are currently offering the OSTP Summer Power-On/ Power-Up program at (14) locations which include (2) specialty programs Camp Adventure and TR Camp Adventure.

Current 24-25 School Year Enrollment: 921 (LINK CLUB registration has not begun and is not included in the current enrollment capacity)

We are currently offering Out of School Time programming at (10) afterschool locations, which include (2) specialty programs (Youth Achieving Greatness and TR Achieving Greatness) and will include (3) LINK Club locations for a total of (13) programming opportunities. Enrollment is ongoing until all available slots are filled.

Partnerships & Collaborations: ACPS, Americans Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), Upcycle, Momentum Collective Inc., and Buddie Ford Nature Center. These partners and organizations are providing specialized programming, academic support, or enrichment activities at Summer Power-On locations.

The OSTP Committee is currently working to revise the OSTP Standard Operating Procedures and OSTP Staff Manual, in addition to revising the OSTP Site Monitoring Observation Form to align our program with program quality standards that are conducive to the service we provide.

Program Wrap-ups:

- Buddie Ford Nature Center held its first **drop-off preschool camp!** Participants learned about animals from different countries all over the world, including Mexico, Egypt, and the Great Barrier reef.
- Buddie Ford Nature Center conducted **Poo-Dunit?** A program focused on the feces different animals produce. Participants made their own poo charts to help them identify what animals might be passing through their backyard.
- During June, OSTP participants at William Ramsay Recreation Center treated their peers to a **special song** and dance performance of Y.M.C.A. This event got the kids excited about performing arts and helped them gain an appreciation for trying new activities even when experiencing initial feelings of nervousness.

Center teamed up with Senior Services of
Alexandria to provide exercise programs to the
Ethiopian community at the Claridge House.
The programs are led by Ms. Karen Rousse,
Patrick Henry staff, on Mondays and Thursdays
from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.



- On June 8, the Leonard "Chick" Armstrong Recreation Center Seniors attended their **Annual Senior Cruise** on the Spirit of Washington. They had a historical tour of Washington DC's landmarks while enjoying creative dishes from the lunch buffet, music (DJ), and dancing. The Spirit of Washington rooftop lounge provided a great view of attractions and the opportunity to snap photos to remember the experience.
- On June 12, Patrick Henry Recreation Center held its End of the School Year Blast for the OSTP Program. Participants enjoyed carnival games, moon bounce, musical chairs, music, food and more.



 On June 15, Leonard "Chick" Armstrong Recreation Center hosted a special pre-Father's Day program.
 This event was a true success, attracting more than 40 fathers and their families to enjoy a day of organized activities which consisted of food, relay races, tug of war, three-legged race, dodgeball, escape room activities, and much more.



- On June 15, the City of Gaithersburg hosted the Mid-Atlantic Recreation and Parks Sports Alliance (MARPSA) **Regional Track and Field Games** at Quince Orchard High School. Forty-six Alexandria participants competed against teams from Prince George's County, City of Gaithersburg, and Rockville.
- Charles Houston Recreation Center recently held its **2**nd **Annual Sneaker Ball.** We grilled hamburgers & hotdogs and had a DJ, picture booth, 360 photobooth, and games for teens.

Mrs. Calderon organizes various engaging activities throughout the school year utilizing our soft playroom and dance studio. Recently, they celebrated the end of the school year with a festive feast, as shown in the photos. The playgroup will resume for the upcoming school year, offering a fun and educational environment for children in Alexandria.



• Nannie J. Lee Recreation Campers have been having a thrilling experience filled with fun at Camp Adventure. From a full-inclusive summer experience with friends, laughter, and great adventure the Teenie Weenie, Therapeutic Recreation, Mini, Youth, and Camp Adventure on the Rise campers are fully engaged in a variety of enrichment activities, adventurous field trips, arts & crafts, STEM, sports, cooperative group games, and swimming.

As we prepare for natural area inspections, our annual invasive control program remains a priority. This year, we will continue to target problematic species such as kudzu, cendeline, and other broadleaf invaders, including Japanese honeysuckle, English ivy, and multiflora rose. Through consistent monitoring and treatment, we aim to mitigate the spread of these invasive plants and protect the integrity of our natural habitats.

For the new fiscal year, the Natural Resource Division will concentrate efforts on meadow restoration and the early detection and treatment of invasive plants within natural areas. These initiatives are crucial for preserving the biodiversity and ecological health of Alexandria's green spaces.

Boy Scout, Henry Mead, selected to beautify and improve the space outside the 4-H office for

his Eagle Scout Project. The before and after pictures below show that the space was overgrown, and the flower beds were falling apart leaving it in poor working conditions for both staff and students of 4-H. Henry repaired the planting beds, planted shrubs in the flower beds that would attract butterflies or birds. He power washed the gazebo and concrete so it can be used for meetings and activities outdoors, mowed and removed unused items from the space, and built a portable table. 4-H plans to work with local students to care for the shrubs in the planting beds as in past years.

North Potomac Yard Park Project Managers: Daniel Unkle, Urban Planner III

Construction began on North Potomac Yard Park in early 2023 as part of the development agreements for North Potomac Yard. A successful collaboration with the community, private development and the City, this new five-acre park is the final segment of the continuous park on

the east edge of Potomac Yard as envisioned in the 1999 Small Area Plan. The first elements of construction focused on establishing infrastructure, stormwater systems, and utilities, followed by the installation of trellis foundations and bridges. The main element of the park is the Potomac Yard Trail shared-use path that links Four Mile Run to the existing trail south to Braddock Road. As work progressed during the year, zones for fitness activities, natural play areas, and seating options were built. By autumn 2023, construction focused on native trees, plants, and lawn areas. As final touches and punch list items are completed this summer, the park is geared to open to the public, offering green spaces for families and students, cyclists, and nature enthusiasts.
