### 2024-2025 OSTP School Year Update:

### Current 24-25 School Year Enrollment: 1,331

We are currently offering out-of-school time programming at (10) afterschool locations, which include (2) specialty programs (Youth Achieving Greatness and TR Achieving Greatness) and (3) LINK Club locations for a total of (13) programming opportunities. Capacity has been filled at each location.

**Partnerships & Collaborations:** ACPS, Americans Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), Upcycle, Momentum Collective Inc., and Buddie Ford Nature Center. These partners and organizations provide specialized programming, academic support, or enrichment activities at the OSTP Power-On afterschool locations.

The OSTP Committee is revising the OSTP Standard Operating Procedures, OSTP Staff Manual, and the OSTP Site Monitoring Observation Form to align our program with program quality standards.

### **Program Wrap-ups:**

• During the summer Charles Houston Recreation Center had three **trips for teens** to Shadowland, Kings Dominion, and a Washington Nationals baseball game with 52 teens attending. The Charles Houston Advisory Council sponsored the Kings Dominion and Shadow trip with the center receiving community tickets from the Nationals team.

• On July 20, over 250 people attended the first "Best of the West" event, hosted by the West End Business Association at Patrick Henry Recreation Center. The event provided a great opportunity for visitors to familiarize themselves with West End retail, restaurants, and nonprofits. Attendees enjoyed items from Taste of Asia's menu, while Hangry Joe's Chicken served its



popular chicken tenders. The event also featured various contests where people could vote for their favorite restaurants.

• On July 25, Patrick Henry Recreation Center hosted a **1 vs 1 basketball tournament** for teens. Teens were placed into two age groups: 12-14 years old and 15-18 years old. In total, we had 19 participants in the event. The tournament was a great success, with the teens showcasing their skills and demonstrating excellent sportsmanship.





• The Patrick Henry Recreation Center recently concluded its Spring and Summer classes on July 31<sup>st</sup>, marking another milestone in its partnership with RPCA, Claridge House, and Senior Services of Alexandria. This collaboration began in January and has engaged senior residents in activities promoting physical and social well-being.

Led by Aida Bolivar, the Silver Artisans class fostered creativity and community, while Karen Rouse's Stay Active & Independent for Life (SAIL) fitness



**program** helped seniors maintain their health. Both programs attracted 30 to 45 participants, highlighting their importance. The Fall session began on September 16, and the center remains committed to offering these enriching programs for seniors. Special thanks to Tesfaye Reta, Mary Lee Anderson, and the team for their dedication.

Recreation Center's Counselors
in Training provided fun games
and activities for Pirate Day.
Throughout the day, participants
of the Power On program had to
find their gold coins hidden
throughout the center and use





their treasure to pay for each station of activities. These activities included Limbo, Walk the Plank, Shark bean bag toss, and more. Prizes were provided for each event.

• August 9<sup>th</sup> marked the end of the summer season for children participating in the **Power-Up summer camp program** at the William Ramsay Recreation Center. Over a period of 8 weeks, children were able to participate in a variety of planned activities, special events, and a grantfunded S.T.E.A.M enrichment program led by Robothink. This program provided an opportunity to build, learn, and play with robots.



- On August 9, Mt. Vernon Recreation Center held its closing day Carnival & Ice Cream Social. This special event is held at the end of the summer to celebrate the end of the Out of School Time Summer Power-On program. Attendees enjoyed ice cream and cake with all the toppings, cooperative games, and craft activities.
- On August 27, Mount Vernon Recreation Center provided childcare for Mount Vernon Community Schools back-to-school night. 116 children attended the event and enjoyed carnival-style games in the gym. We also used this event as a marketing tool to pass out program guides and flyers for upcoming events.
- Patrick Henry Recreation Center's Summer Camp participants enjoyed an array of activities and trips. They beat the heat with Water Days filled with outdoor water balloon fights and weekly trips to Old Town Pool. Participants also enjoyed recycling-based scavenger hunts, and the rec's newest Game Room additions; including but not limited to a billiards and air hockey table. They enjoy various arts and crafts projects that they get to take home as well as enriching STEM activities.



- Wonderful Wednesday is an end-of-summer event where campers can kick back, relax, and enjoy the last days of summer camp. Campers engaged in crafts, cooperative games, relay races, inflatable attractions and games, performing arts, Spin Wheel rides, Karaoke, a Game Truck, Glo Dance party, and much more! We ended the program with a STEM show by Mad Science, Things that Go BOOM! Over 250 youth participated in this year's Wonderful Wednesday event. It was a great way to end the summer.
- Campers at William Ramsay Recreation Center participated in the Alexandria Library's Summer Quest Summer Reading Program. Each day during D.E.A.R (Drop Everything and Read), reading time was logged and totaled up at the end of the summer. Children were rewarded with books, and free tickets to attend a professional baseball game with their families.
- On August 17, Williams Ramsay Recreation Center held a Back-to-School event. Over 500 bookbags filled with school supplies were distributed. It was a big success, thanks to our partners Fresh Start Refugee/NOVA RAFT and METWC.



### **Program Updates:**

• Starting this fall, the Sports Section will partner with the **Work'n Well Employee Program**. City employees participating in the City Cup league will earn Work'n Well reward points. The Work'n Well Rewards program offers fun and engaging challenges, helpful educational content, wearable fitness devices, and tools to encourage you to make your total well-being a priority. The objective is to help you make long-lasting behavior changes that will lead to improvements in multiple aspects of health.

- On September 15, Chinquapin Recreation Center will start a 15% off fitness pass sale.
- On September 28, the Recreation Services Division under the Youth Activities Section will co-host with the Kiwanis Club, its **Annual Kiwanis Kids Fishing Day at Lake Cook**. This year we are also partnering with the Make-A-Wish Foundation to provide fishing opportunities to youth with terminal illnesses. During this event, OSTP youth ages 8 to 12 years old will have an opportunity to get out and experience fishing for the first time or for the hundredth time. Participants will fish for a couple of hours, have lunch, and go home with some great memories and fun experiences.

- On October 4, Charles Houston Recreation Center will host the annual "Teens vs Cops" basketball game. Participants will enjoy a DJ, food, and a competitive basketball game. Who will have the bragging rights this year?
- On October 11, Mt. Vernon Recreation Center will recognize **National Bullying Prevention Month** by hosting Bully Free activities for OSTP program participants.
- On October 20, Chinquapin Park will host the **2024 NOVA Maker Fair** from 10:00 am 4:00 pm. We will have a functioning Black Smith Forge on site, so Please join us for a showcase of exciting innovations from local artists, craftspeople, teachers, and engineers!
- On October 24, Mount Vernon Recreation Center will host **Lights On After School** in conjunction with After School Alliance to call attention to the importance of afterschool programs for America's children, families, and communities.


### **Special Feature:**

### NATURAL RESOURCES

### Oscar Mendoza, Division Chief

In line with the systematic approach to controlling non-native invasive species (NNI), Tarleton Park will be treated this month, targeting kudzu, tree of heaven, bush honeysuckle, multiflora rose, and mimosa.

The site assessment was completed in late August, during which invasive species were identified and the extent of the infestation was determined. Consistent with environmentally friendly practices and best management strategies, several areas were prioritized for treatment. Control methods were selected based on the environmental conditions and the park's ecosystem. Mechanical control will be the primary approach in areas where invasive species can be fully removed, including their root systems. Herbicide application will only be used when deep-rooted species make mechanical control insufficient. Follow-up monitoring will track regrowth and the emergence of new invasive plants.

#### **URBAN FORESTRY**

Phil Jubert, Urban Forest Manager

- *Tree Planting* Urban Forestry is on pace to plant a record number of trees (our planting records go back to 1990). If the fall planting season goes as planned (weather permitting), our total tree tally will be over 1,000 on a 12-month rolling basis.
- *Volunteer* Multiple community groups are donating their time this fall and helping to plant 100 trees throughout Four Mile Run, Holmes Run, and Mt. Jefferson Park. The financial savings are reinvested into our young tree program to improve survivability.
- Outreach Urban Forestry is leading efforts to become a Bee City USA member.
- Safety The top priority for Urban Forestry is public safety. July, August, and September are peak months for responding to trees that have failed due to weather.

# **Summer 2024 Court Improvements Project Managers: Daniel Unkle, Urban Planner III**

Several courts across the City were improved over the past summer. Court work is scheduled during the summer months due to temperature restrictions for material installation. Work was completed at the Lee Center, Potomac Yard Park and George Mason Park.

### Lee Center Tennis Court Renovation

The renovation at Lee Center included several key updates: the installation of new asphalt surfacing, a new color coat, and essential fence repairs. The tennis court was also relined, and four new pickleball courts were added to enhance the facility's recreational offerings.

### Lee Center Basketball Court Surface Repairs

The basketball courts at Lee Center underwent extensive repairs, including crack repairs, the application of a new color coat, and the installation of new lining, revitalizing the courts for improved playability.

### Potomac Yard Park Tennis Court Repairs

At Potomac Yard Park, repair work focused on crack repairs and the application of Mapei mesh fiberglass resurfacing to bolster the courts' durability. The courts also received a new color coat and lining. Additionally, four new pickleball courts were introduced to expand the park's functionality.

#### George Mason Tennis Courts

The George Mason Tennis Courts received targeted maintenance, including crack repairs and the application of a spot color coat.
