
## **Project Scope**

Check valves (one-way flow gates) within the storm sewer to prevent backflow




Trench drains along the curb line



Impact	Mitigation
Road Closures & Detours	Access to residents will be maintained
Sidewalk Closures	Access to residents will be maintained
Typical Construction Traffic & Noise	Standard construction hours are between 7:00 AM and 6:00 PM M-F and 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM on Saturday
Water Disconnections	Waterline re-location requires temporary shutoff of municipal water; additional noticing will be provided to impacted residents
Gas Disconnections	The installation of vaults within the alley will may require temporary disconnections of gas services; however, the City and Washington Gas will coordinate with residents should the situation arise.
