

## Budget Overview

- City Manager presented City Council proposed FY 2026 budget
  - February 25
- Council Adoption April 30
- Proposed Budget
  - Operating Budget FY 26: \$956.5 mil
  - 10-year CIP Budget FY 25-34: \$2.07 billion



## Transportation Investments-Operating and CIP Highlights

6.2% Increase in DASH Funding

WMATA Ops funding decreased \$75 M to \$65.9 M

\$13.7 M to Complete Streets

\$7.5 M for SRTS

\$7.8 M -Sidewalk Maintenance

\$186.4 M for WMATA Capital

\$66 M for street reconstruction and resurfacing




