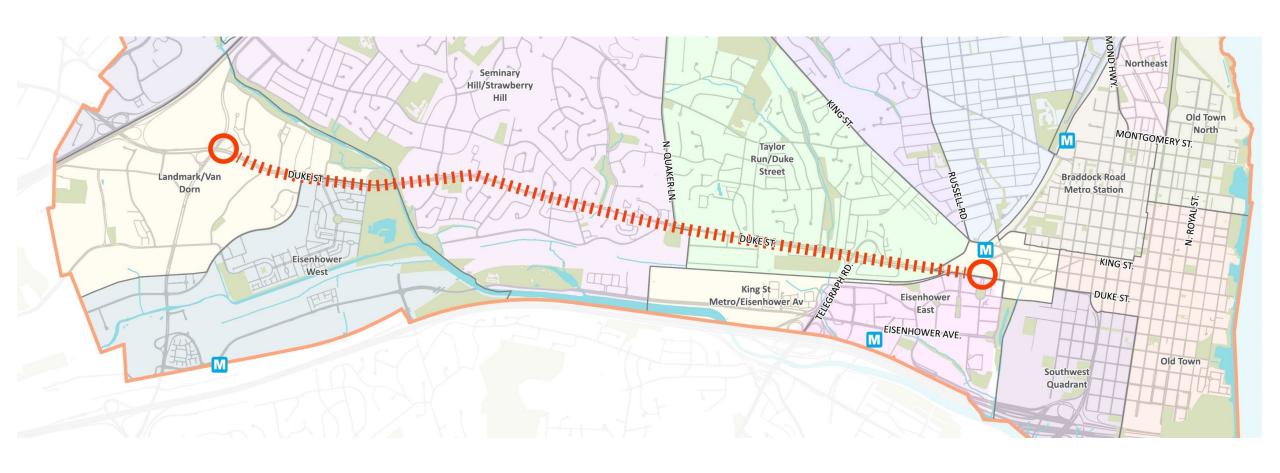

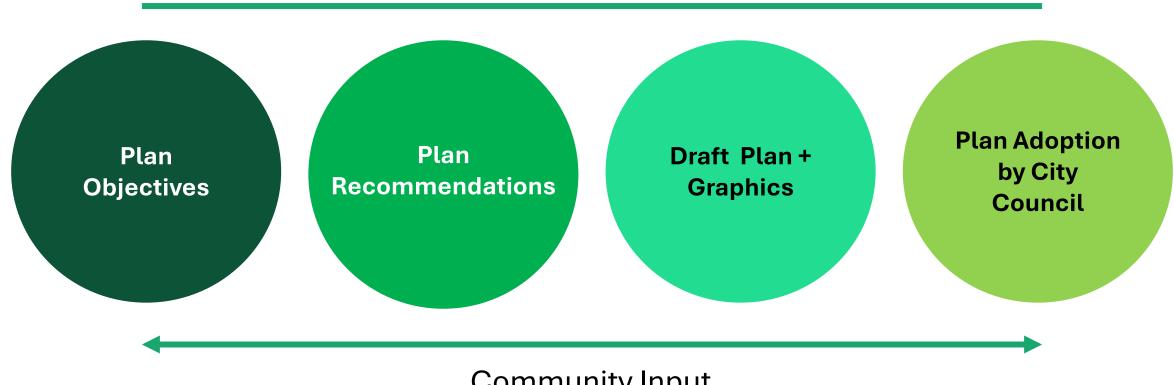

Importance of Land Use Planning – From Plan to Place



A Plan is a land use framework that establishes shared expectations for the City, community, and property owners for the mid to long-term future of a geographic area. For example, plans identify the location of **new parks** and **new bike connections**, capture **design elements** important to the community, and identify **appropriate land uses**.

It is important that plans be periodically updated to:

- Anticipate upcoming changes to land uses because of market and economic conditions,
- Incorporate new City policies and best practices,
- Be eligible and competitive for State and Federal grant funding.

It is about creating a place that is safe, attractive, and accessible and builds on the many existing great characteristics of each neighborhood.

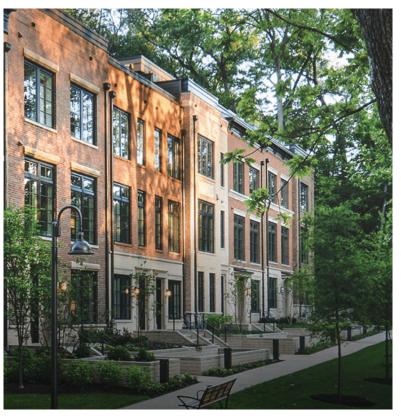

What are the Steps of Land Use Planning?

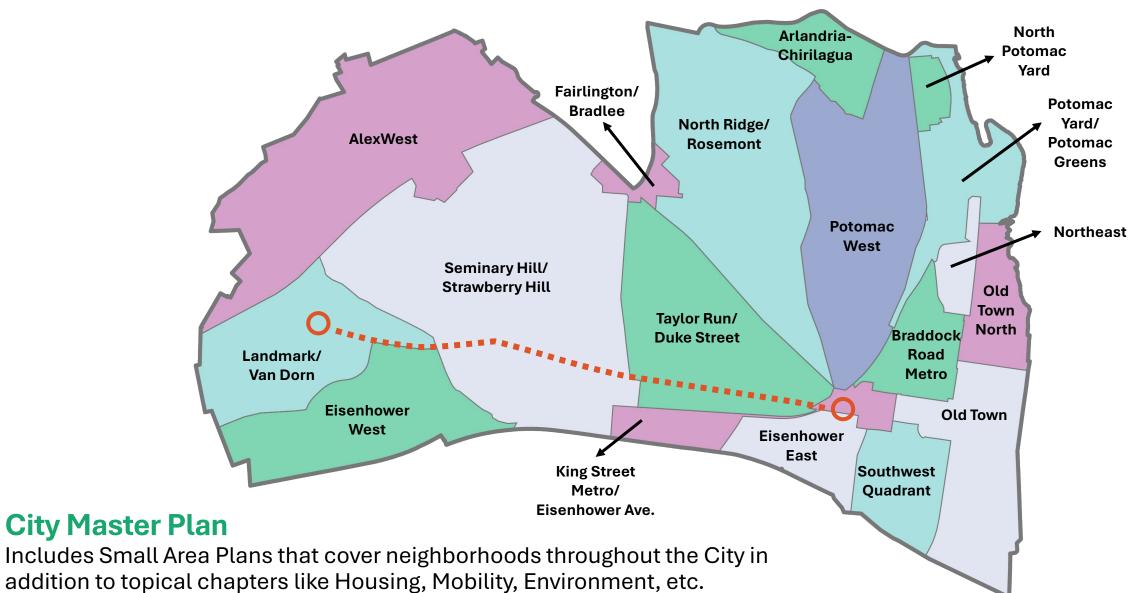
Step 1: Small Area Plan – the BIG PICTURE

Step 2: Zoning – the DETAILS

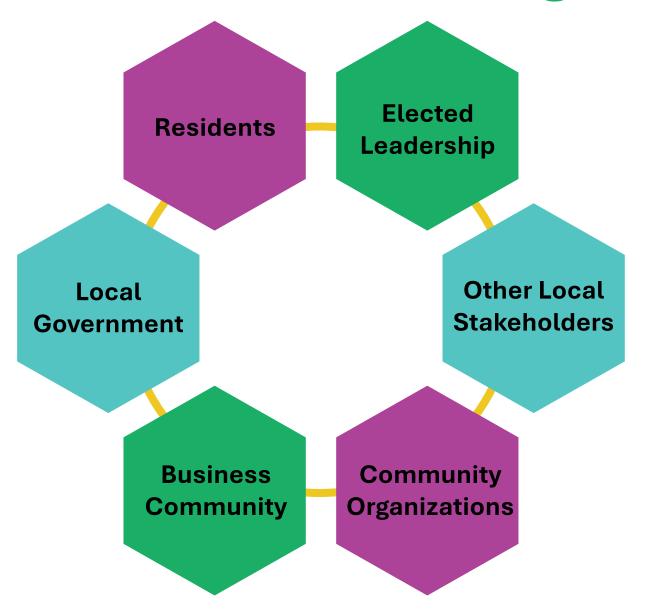
Step 3: Development Approval and Construction – the PROJECTS Or

Who is Involved in Planning?

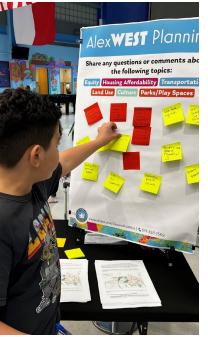


Why Participate?

What Planning Can and Can't Do:

What CAN planning do?

- Create a vision for a specified plan area
- Address quality of life elements like:
 - Access to amenities, safety walking/biking, transit, parks, and open space
- Achieve affordable housing in exchange for density

What CAN'T planning do?

- Replace the market/land economics (can't change the fact that rents are going up)
- Override existing land use approvals
- Go beyond Virginia state limitations regarding affordable housing. For example, no rent control or inclusionary zoning
