**Question:**

Can you provide information on the level of funding we have provided (from ARPA, general fund, or other sources) to our Eviction Prevention Fund in the last 3 fiscal years and what is proposed in this year's budget?

**Response:**

Emergency rental assistance is available for Alexandria residents who are at risk of eviction due to unexpected income loss and have income at or below the 200% federal poverty level.
