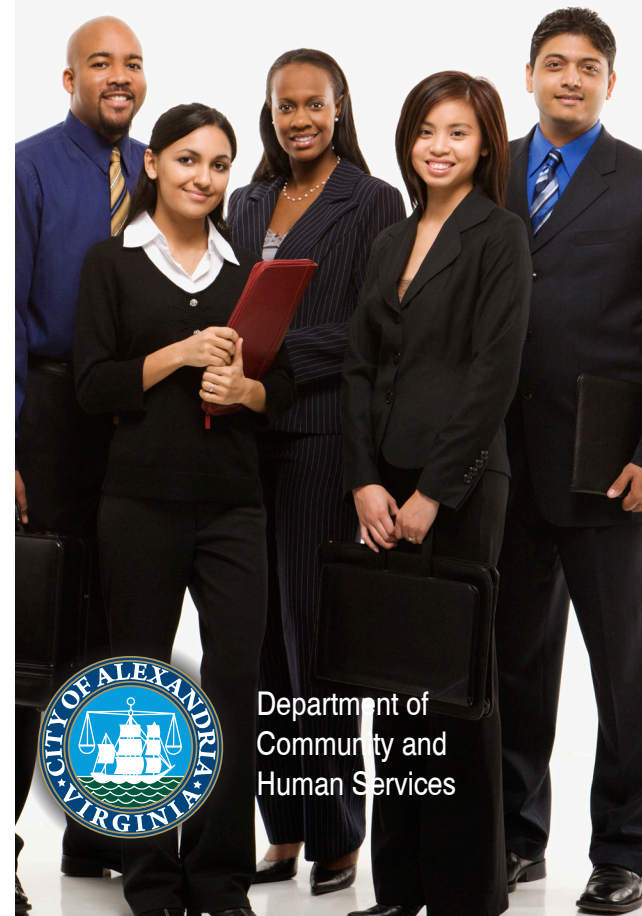

SNAPET

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Employment and Training (SNAPET) is a voluntary program designed to assist SNAP participants with finding employment. If you qualify, you can VOLUNTEER to receive help improving your job skills.

SNAPET program workers are here to help you evaluate your job readiness and provide referrals to services that may enhance your employability.

In Virginia, SNAPET is composed of several components designed to help you reach your goal of employment or, if you are already employed, career advancement.

The following services are available at the City of Alexandria Workforce Development Center (WDC) and are based on need and availability:

- Job club
- Job search
- Job readiness
- Vocational training
- Education services such as online learning, adult basic education, General Education Development (GED), and community college programs

Benefits and Services

- Employment and training for ex-offenders
- Employment and training for refugees
- Work experience
- Post-employment services
- Supportive services including transportation

After an initial assessment by the SNAPET program worker, you and the employee will create a Plan of Participation outlining a strategy to achieve long- and short-term career goals.
