### **Residential Treatment Services**

The Department of Community & Human Services partners with Arlington County and other local agencies to link residents with community-based intensive clinical services in a structured residential setting for individuals (age 18+) who are unable to stop using alcohol or drugs.

Most residential programs provide two levels of treatment to support and build early recovery skills. Withdrawal Management provides medical and nursing support to individuals whose substance use requires medical intervention for safe detoxification. These inpatient stays usually last 10-14 days based on medical assessments. Following safe substance withdrawal, individuals can access short- or long-term residential treatment programs, aimed at assisting individuals in identifying goals for ongoing stability, health, and recovery. Counselors, case managers, and recovery peers are available to support smooth transition back to the community and linkage to aftercare services.

Anyone who is unable to stop using alcohol or illicit drugs, or who has experienced problems associated with their use, may benefit from treatment. The cost of services is based on income.

### **Outpatient Services**

Outpatient services offers adults (18+) combination of treatment services that help reduce symptoms of their substance use disorder, enhance stability, engage in recovery and improve their lives.

- A variety of group treatment options
- Individual therapy
- Psychiatric services
- Case management
- Peer recovery services
- Access to community services

Outpatient services are most helpful for those whose substance use creates problems in their lives, but who have a stable place to live and support for making changes.

#### **Opioid Treatment Program**

The Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) adds medication to the Outpatient Services. Therapy plus medication (Buprenorphine, Methadone) is the best treatment for those who are physically dependent on opioids. Through engagement in the program, adults (18+) develop a satisfying life free of illicit drugs. The medication, which is administered and monitored by medical and nursing staff, removes the cravings for opioids while therapy supports clients in learning relapse prevention skills and developing a recovery plan, thus improving their overall health.

# Services for Family and Friends

For those whose friends or loved ones are concerned and/or supportive of their recovery, these options are available:

#### **Understanding Recovery**

Psychoeducational group is 13-week recovery group open to clients as well as to family and friends. Group is offered on Wednesdays from 11:00am to 12:00pm.

#### **Outpatient Services**
