## Dear Secretary Duffy:

I am writing to express the City of Alexandria's support for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) PROTECT Grant application, which addresses critical infrastructure needs for essential transportation corridors in the National Capital Region (NCR). This project will assess flood vulnerability, estimate potential physical damages and service disruptions, evaluate economic impacts, and develop technical solutions to reduce flood risks across WMATA's transit system. The King Street-Old Town Station in Alexandria is one of the seven stations included in this endeavor.

In the City of Alexandria, we work closely with WMATA to ensure the continuity of our region's transportation network. Unfortunately, our region has experienced a significant increase in extreme rainfall events, with mounting risks to the reliability of critical transportation infrastructure.

The assessment prioritizes critical transfer stations and hightraffic corridors that serve as essential links in the regional transportation network. Protecting these vital connections will strengthen our region's economic competitiveness and operational resilience.
