
Alexandria is an affordable place for families to live

STRATEGIES FOR CHANGE

Key Strategies for change in affordable housing:

- 1. Increase public funding
 - 2.Inclusionary zoning
 - 3. Supportive housing programs

CHAMPION

- Local Government Agencies: Housing authorities, city planning departments, and public housing commissions.
- Legal Aid Organizations: Groups that help tenants fight evictions and enforce fair housing
- Community/Families: Residents that live in the neighborhood or in the area.

PARTNERS

Local governments help create affordable housing by setting zoning rules, offering incentives to builders, funding housing programs, using public land for development, partnering with organizations, and enforcing housing standards.

WHAT HAS BEEN DONE SO FAR?

Alexandria, Virginia supports affordable housing by funding new developments like the Sansé and Naja project, preserving existing units, offering renter support programs, and reforming zoning laws to allow more housing types.

HOW MUCH WAS DONE?

Between January 2014 and March 2024, Alexandria has created, converted, or preserved approximately

1,668 AFFORDABLE HOUSING UNITS.

This brings the city closer to its housing plan goal of 2,000 units by 2026.

HOW WELL WAS IT DONE?

We did well by resident satisfaction and affordability level. Building standards and equity inclusion in the houses that the city built. Long-term affordability, units guaranteed to remain affordable for 30+ years

WHAT HAVE BEEN THE EFFECTS SO FAR?

Affordable housing efforts in Alexandria have slightly boosted nearby property values and exceeded long-term building goals, but the city still struggles to meet rising demand. Many residents spend over 30% of their income on housing.

WHAT ARE PLANS FOR THE FUTURE?

Alexandria plans to expand affordable housing through its updated Housing 2040 Master Plan, new developments, and continued partnerships with housing agencies and developers.
